- In the event of rain while cooking with oil/grease, cover the cooking vessel immediately and turn off the appliance burners and gas supply. Do not attempt to move the appliance or pooking vessel.
- When cooking, the appliance must be on a level, stable surface in an erea clear of combustible material. An asphalt surface (blacktop) may not be acceptable for this purpose.
- Do not leave the appliance unattended. Keep children and pets away from the appliance at all times.
- Do not place empty cooking vessel on the appliance while in operation, Use caution when placing anything in cooking vessel while the appliance is in operation.
- Do not move the appliance when in use. Allow the cooking vessel to cool before moving or storing.

#### • EXPLOSION - FIRE HAZARD

- Never store propana near high heat, open flames, pilot lights, direct sunlight, other lgnl-tion sources or where temperatures exceed 120 degrees F (49°C).
- Propene gas is heavier then eir and leaking propane will sink to the lowest level possible, it can ignite by ignition sources including matches, tighters, sparks or open flames of any kind many feet away from the original leak. If you smell cas, leave the area immediately.
- Never install or remove propane tank while outdoor stove is lighted, near flame, pilot lights, other lightion sources or while outdoor stove is hot to touch.
- During operation, this product can be a source of ignition. Never use the stove in spaces that contain or may contain volatile or airborne combustibles, or products such as gesoffine, solvents, paint thinner, dust particles or unknown chemicals. Minimum distance from sides and back of unit to walts or railings is 12 inchos (30.5 cm). Do not use under overhead unprotected combustible construction.
- Provide adequate clearances around air openings into the combustion chamber.
- DO NOT use gas stove indoors or in garages, breezeways, sheds or enclosed areas.
- Do not obstruct the flow of combustion and ventilation air.

- This appliance is not intended for commercial use.

#### CARSON MONOXIDE HAZARD

- This stove is a combustion appliance. All combustion appliances produce carbon monoxide (CO) during the combustion process. This product is designed to produce extremely minute, non-hazardous amounts of CO if used and maintained in accordance with all warnings and instructions. Do not block air flow into or out of the stove.
- Carbon Monoxide (CO) poisoning produces flu-like symptoms, watery eyes, headaches, dizziness, fatigue and possibly death. You can't see it and you can't smell it. It's an invisible killer. If these symptoms are present during operation of this product get fresh air immediately!
- For outdoor use only. If stored indoors, detach cylinder outdoors.
- Never use inside house, camper, tent, vehicle or other unventilated or enclosed areas. This atove consumes air (oxygeh).
   Do not use in unventilated or enclosed areas to avoid endangering your life.

## **A WARNING**

- This product is fueled by propane gas. Propane gas is invisible, odorless, and flammable. An odorent is normally added to help detect leaks and can be described as a "rotten egg" smell. The odorant can tade over time so leaking gas is not always detectable by smell alone.
- Use only propane gas set up for vapor withdrawal.
- Propane gas should be stored or used in compliance with local ordinances and codes or with ANSI/NEPA 58. Turn off propane and disconnect cylinder when not in use.
- Cylinders must be stored out of reach of children.

- Clean stove frequently to avoid grease accumutation and possible grease fires.



#### Attach Propane Cylinder

■ Before attaching propane cylinder make sure burner valves are in the OFF position. (Fig. 13)



- Remove plastic cap from top of propane cylinder and screw cylinder into regulator hand tight. (Fig. 14)
- Lift up on cylinder support on back or stove and swing out. (Fig. 15)
- Screw regulator into stove hand tight. (Fig. 16) Place cylinder into cylinder
- support (Fig. 17)

🚃 To open lid, move lever to OPEN position and lift up. (Fig. 19)



■ Place a grill, griddle, or stove ring over each burner. (Fig. 20, 21, and 22)








## WARNING

DQ NOT operate the stove with side tables in storage position. Damage will occur and vold

■ To extend side tables, grasp hold of side tables on bottom of stove and slide out until fully extended. (Fig. 23)



## **Burner and Orifice**

■ Proper location of the burner with respect to the orifice is important. To verify the proper installation of the burner tube, use a screwdriver to remove the stove top. The burner tube must be located over the ortfice fitting. See Fig. 24 (stove top not shown).





■ Check and clean the burner/venturi tubes for insects and insect nests. A clogged tube can lead to a fire beneath the appliance.

## Leak Check

## WARNING

- Perform leak test outdoors.
- Extinguish all open flames.
- NEVER leak test when smoking.
- Do not use the outdoor stove until connection has been leak tested and does not leak.

■ Note: Use Coleman® 16.4 oz. disposable propane cylinders. The LP-gas supply cylinder to be used must be constructed and marked in accordance with the specifications for LP-gas cylinders of the U.S. Department of Transportation (DCIT) or the National Standard of Canada, CAN/CSA B339, Cylinders, Spheres and Tubes for the Transportation of Dangarous Goods.

- For outdoor use only.
- Never use inside house, camper, tent, vehicle or other unwentilated or enclosed areas. This stove consumes air (axygen). Do not use in unventilated or enclosed areas to avoid endangering your life.

# • EXPLOSION - FIRE HAZARD

- Propane is heavier than air and can accumulate in low places. If you small gas, leave the area immediately.
- Always attach or detach propane source outdoors; never while stove is lighted, near flame, plict lights, other ignition sources or while stove is hot to touch.
- •This stove is very hot during use and can ignite flammables too close to the burners. Minimum distance from eldes and back of unit to walls or railings is 12 Inches (So.5 cm). Do not use under overheed unprotected combustible construction. Keep gasoline and other flammable liquids and vapors well away from stove.
- Do not attempt to operate until you have read and understood all General Safety Information in this manual and all assambly is complete and leak checks have been performed.

#### INSTASTART™ Electronic Ignition

- Set on sturdy, flat surface. For outdoor use only.
- Open burner valve and push igniter button repeatedly until burner lights. (Fig. 25)

Note: If igniter fails to light stove, use match to light burner. If the stove is wet the ignitor may not spark.



#### Match Light


- Set on sturdy, flat surface.
  For outdoor use only.
- Remove cooking surface.
- Hold lighted match near burner and open burner valve. (Fig. 26)



 Adjust flame with burner valve. (Fig. 27)



 A good flame should be blue with minimal yellow tip. Some yellow tips on flames are acceptable as long as no carbon or soot deposits appear. (Fig. 28)



# Tips Before Cooking

# A CAUTION

DO NOT place a pot or a pan on grill surface. Damage will occur and void the warranty.

- Clean cooking surfaces before first use.
- To reduce sticking and improve clean-up, spray cooking surface with vegetable oil prior to lighting stove.
- Use the flat griddle surface for eggs, thin pieces of meat, fish or vegetables.

  The grill surface is ideal for steaks, hamburgers,
- or chicken.
- Use the chromed stove grate anytime you wish to place a pot on the stove.

## To Turn Off

■ Turn off burner valve. (Flg. 29)



## To Clean

- Make sure stove is cool.
   Move stove away from flame (including pilot lights) and other ignition sources.
   Remove regulator from stove. (Fig. 30)
- Flemove propane cylinder from regulator and replace protective cap on cylinder. (Fig. 31)





■ Wipe clean with soft cloth and mild dish detergent. Do not use abrasives. (Fig. 32)



## To Store

## DANGER



- EXPLOSION FIRE HAZARD
- Never store propane near high heat, open flames, pilot lights, direct sunlight, other igni-tion sources or where temperatures exceed 120 degrees F (49°C).
- The cylinder must be disconnected when the atove is in storage.
- Do not store a spare LP-gas cylinder under or near this appliance. Failure to follow the above instructions exactly may result in fire causing death or serious injury.

■ For storage or transport, drip tray and regulator may be located below stove. (Fig. 33 and Fig. 34)





■ When transporting stove, ensure that lid is locked. (Fig. 35)



- Push in side tables to storage position. Pull back on stove handle to unlock leg brace from brackets under stove. (Fig. 36 and Fig. 37)
- Flg. 36



■ Fold up stove stand. (Fig. 38 and Fig. 39)





■ Make sure to push down on stove to lock bracket on bottom of stove onto tongue brace. (Fig. 40 and 41)







# Things You Should Know

- It is unsate and illegal in some places to store or use propane cylinders of greater than 1.14 kg (2.5 lbs) water capacity (approximately 1 lb. propane) in occupied enclosures.
- The usual storage areas for camping and pichlic equipment are the basement, attic, or garage. To evoid the accumulation of dust, cobwepte, etc., that is common in these areas, place your stove in a plastic bag and seal it with a rubber band.
