

- 1. Read all instructions in this manual before assembling or using your vacuum cleaner.
- Use your cleaner only as described in this manual. Use only with Panasonic recommended attachments.
- **3. Disconnect** electrical supply before servicing or cleaning out the brush area. Failure to do so could result in electrical shock or the brush suddenly starting.
- Do not leave cleaner when plugged in. Unplug from outlet when not in use and before servicing.
- 5. To reduce the risk of electrical shock Do not use outdoors or on wet surfaces.
- Do not allow to be used as a toy. Close attention is necessary when used by or near children.
- 7. Do not use with a damaged cord or plug. If cleaner is not working as it should, has been dropped, damaged, left outdoors, or dropped in water, return it to a Panasonic Service Center.
- 8. Do not pull or carry by cord, use cord as a handle, close a door on cord, or pull cord around sharp edges or corners. Do not run cleaner over cord. Keep cord away from heated surfaces.
- 9. Do not unplug by pulling on cord. To unplug, grasp the plug, not the cord.
- 10. Do not handle plug or cleaner with wet hands.
- 11.Do not put any objects into openings.



GROUNDING INSTRUCTIONS



This vacuum cleaner must be grounded. If it should malfunction or breakdown, grounding provides a path of least resistance for electric current to reduce the risk of electric shock. This vacuum cleaner is equipped with a cord having an equipment-grounding conductor and grounding plug. The plug must be plugged into an appropriate outlet that is properly installed and grounded in accordance with all local codes and ordinances.




- Improper connection of the equipmentgrounding conductor can result in a risk of electric shock. Check with a qualified electrician or service person if you are in doubt as to whether the outlet is properly grounded.
- ➤ Do not modify the plug provided with the vacuum cleaner if it will not fit the outlet, have a proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician.
- This vacuum cleaner is for use on a nominal 120-volt circuit, and has a grounding plug that looks like the plug illustrated in (Figure A). Make sure that this vacuum cleaner is connected to an outlet having the same configuration as the plug.
- No adapter should be used with this vacuum cleaner.

Note: Before you plug in your Panasonic vacuum cleaner, make sure that the voltage indicated on the rating plate located at the back of the vacuum cleaner is the same as your local supply.





Attaching Handle





- > Remove handle screw.
- Insert handle with cord hook to the back of the cleaner.





- > Tighten screw.





- Secure retainer (plug head) to power cord.


Tool Storage



- Some tools may already be stored on vacuum cleaner.
- Insert crevice tool, cleaning end first, into end of telescopic wand opposite the suction control.
- Place telescopic wand on back of cleaner with crevice tool on top.
- Store dusting brush and upholstery tool in rear of dust compartment.
- Insert hose into opening at back of nozzle.
- ➤ To use telescopic wand for cleaning, attach it to hose by aligning the two (2) raised tabs on wand with "J" slots in hose, guide tabs along grooves, twist to lock in place.



Motor Protector




- Automatically opens to provide cooling air to the motor when a clog occurs or when dust bag needs changing.
- Motor protector may open when using tools.
- ➤ If motor protector opens, the vacuum will make a slightly different sound.

Note: Do not block motor protector.



ON-OFF Switch




- ➤ Ensure ON-OFF switch is OFF.







Using Tools








Agitator rotates when using tools, use care to ensure that nothing comes into contact with agitator.

- Remove lower end of stretch hose from the back of the nozzle by twisting and pulling straight out.
- The tools can be attached to hose, wand or crevice tool.
- Remove telescopic wand from vacuum.
- Remove crevice tool from telescopic wand.
- To extend wand, turn locking ring to UNLOCK position and pull out to full length.
- ➤ Turn locking ring to LOCK position.
- DO NOT overextend your reach with hose as it could tip vacuum.
- Place all tools and hose back in the same manner as shown in TOOL STORAGE.





ROUTINE CARE OF CLEANER


Performing the following tasks will keep your new Panasonic vacuum cleaner operating at peak performance levels and will ensure these high levels for years to come. Check the BEFORE REQUESTING SERVICE section in this manual for recommendations on performing some of these tasks to help solve various problems that may occur.

Cleaning Secondary Foam Filter



- Secondary foam filter protects the motor.
- Check filter when installing a new dust bag.
- If dirty, pull filter from bottom of dust compartment and clean by rinsing in water.
- > When dry, slide filter back into place.
- Ensure filter is fully inserted under plastic rib projections.

Replacing HEPA Exhaust Filter



- ➤ The HEPA exhaust filter removes dirt from recirculated air.
- Check filter when installing a new dust bag.
- To check filter, place handle in low position.
- Press inward on both sides of exhaust panel and remove by pulling forward.
- > Remove filter if dirty.
- Place new filter (Panasonic MC-V197H only) in exhaust panel. <u>DO NOT</u> CLEAN WITH WATER*.
- Position new filter so slits in filter fit around the four (4) raised pins.
- * Filter cannot be cleaned and should be replaced at least once each year.

Changing Dust Bag

Always operate vacuum with genuine Panasonic Type U3 Standard or U6 Electrostatic dust bags installed. Panasonic dust bags may be purchased through any authorized Panasonic dealer or ordered from service company.

Press release button and pull outward to remove dust cover.

2)

Remove dust bag by grasping cardboard portion and pulling out.

3)

Spread out new dust bag, taking care not to tear bag.

4)

Attach new dust bag onto bag holder by holding cardboard portion and pushing back.

5)

Reinsert tab on end of dust cover into groove on dust compartment to allow cover to rotate closed.


Rotate dust cover up into closed position and press into place without pinching dust bag.




Removing and Installing Lower Plate




- Before servicing any parts, disconnect vacuum from electrical outlet.
- Always place paper under nozzle anytime lower plate is removed to protect floor.
- Place handle in upright position and turn vacuum over to expose lower plate.
- Release lower plate by removing two (2) screws and pressing inward on two (2) locking tabs.
- Remove lower plate and remove any residue that may exist in belt area.
- Reinstall lower plate by hooking front end of lower plate into slots on front of nozzle housing.
- Make sure all wires are routed properly and not pinched.
- Press lower plate until locking tabs snap into place then replace two (2) screws.

Replacing Belt









- Replace belt whenever a burning rubber smell caused by excessive slippage occurs.
- > Remove lower plate.
- Remove agitator by carefully lifting out.
- > Remove worn or broken belt.
- > Clean agitator.
- Loop new belt (Panasonic Type UB8 only) around motor shaft and agitator pulley; see illustration for correct belt routing.
- Reinstall agitator back into nozzle housing grooves.
- After reinstalling the agitator, turn it by hand to make sure that belt is not twisted or pinched and that all rotating parts turn freely.
- > Reinstall lower plate.

Cleaning Agitator




- Clean agitator after every five uses and every time the belt is replaced.
- > Remove lower plate.
- Cut off any carpet pile and lint entangled around agitator with a pair of scissors.
- > Remove agitator.
- Remove any string or debris located on the end caps, washers or agitator shaft.
- Reinstall agitator and lower plate.

Replacing Agitator



- When the bristles on the agitator are worn so that they do not touch a card held across the lower plate, the agitator should be replaced.
- Remove lower plate and agitator.
- Position belt over belt pulley on the new brush unit.
- > Reinstall agitator and lower plate.


Agitator Assembly



Cleaning Exterior and Tools


- Unplug cord from wall outlet.
- > Clean exterior using a clean, soft cloth that has been dipped in a solution of mild liquid detergent and water and wrung dry.
- > DO NOT drip water on cleaner and wipe dry after cleaning.
- > DO NOT clean tools in dishwasher or clothes washer.
- Wash tools in warm soapy water, rinse and air dry.
- DO NOT use tools if they are wet.

Removing Clogs



The hose located on the back of the vacuum cleaner carries the dirt from the nozzle up to the dust bag. If the hose should become clogged:

- Unplug vacuum.
- Disconnect wand from short hose and check the wand and hose.
- > Plug in vacuum cleaner and turn on.
- Disconnect wand and stretch hose in and out to remove clog.



- If clog still exists, turn vacuum cleaner OFF and UNPLUG POWER CORD.
- ➤ Turn vacuum over and inspect agitator area for clogs.
